FROM THE PASTOR

Three months ago this week, we cut the ribbon and dedicated our new Westminster Wing. There are still a few items to be scratched off the to-do list, which are slowly but surely being addressed. But for the most part we've begun to settle in pretty well.

Here are a few things I've noticed:

New faces – every Monday morning in staff meeting, someone on the staff makes a comment about the number of visitors we've seen in worship each week this summer. The summer months are usually not a time we see a lot of new faces, but we certainly have this year. Our consultants told us this would happen: that when people see construction happening at a church, they think "maybe there's a place for me there." I hope you'll keep your eyes open for those new faces as well, and make sure that those friends feel welcomed and find ways to connect in this congregation. And maybe you have others you know from work, school or neighborhood who do not have a church home. I hope you will invite them to be a part of our life together at New Providence as well.

New programs – new space has given rise to lots of creativity about new programs and possibilities, and has also allowed for the growth of existing programs. The youth council is working diligently on an afterschool program focused particularly on our neighbors around the church. Other groups are talking about volleyball leagues and community dinners. Meanwhile, the Welcome Table has grown by about 30%, and is now regularly serving more than 150 guests every Wednesday night. The Presbyterian Women kicked off their year this past Sunday with more than 80 in attendance; that came on the heels of a lovely luncheon at which 130 of us welcomed the new Maryville College President and his family.

All of that has been possible because we have had space to grow and open the arms of this church to embrace all whom God might call here.

New "feel" – this is a little more difficult to put into words, but it seems to me that new space has led to a new feeling of openness and energy. For one thing, we're not just stacked on top of each other or squeezed into inadequate quarters. With room to grow, I sense a feeling of optimism and possibility. Worship has been joyous and fulfilling. The Atrium welcomes friends and invites conversation and community. Well-designed youth space has fostered spiritual growth and fellowship. It's one of those things that's intangible, but real nonetheless.

All of that has come with a pricetag, of course, and by November we will have secured permanent financing and hopefully locked in a low interest rate on our loan. But we still have much work to do to pay that off.

If you made a pledge to the *Follow the Vision* campaign, thank you. I hope you will be faithful to that commitment, as best you are able. If you are new to NPPC since the time of that campaign, I hope you'll consider making a gift, payable over the next two years, to help us move forward. It would be a great tragedy if we had to sacrifice programs because of our financial obligations. If you're able to help with that, I hope you will.

Meanwhile, there is much to celebrate, and I hope you will join me and the officers of the church as we continue to seek God's will for our congregation and the best stewardship of our resources. It is an exciting time, and I am glad to be a part of it.

It is a joy to be the church with you!

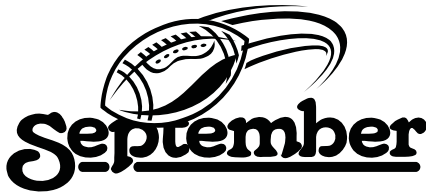
