## FROM THE PASTOR

As I write, we are still basking in the glow of a wonderful combined worship service and lunch with our sisters and brothers from St. Paul AME Zion on Sunday, February 19. I have struggled to find words to describe it other than to say we may have planned, but the Holy Spirit showed up, and that made all the difference. Someone thanked me on their way out of the sanctuary, and all I could say was that no thanks were due to me – this was truly an event in which the whole was much, much greater than the sum of its parts. It was a holy, blessed, life-giving mystery.

How God acts in our lives is often a mystery. You know what that's like: you're standing at the kitchen sink, or watching the sun set out the window of an airplane, and someone speaks, or there's a particular scent, or you remember a specific moment or you're flooded with some emotion and all of a sudden you know that God is in that place – and that you will never be the same.

British poet T.S. Eliot puts it more succinctly:

*You are not here to verify,  
Instruct yourself, or inform curiosity  
Or carry report. You are here to kneel.*

As we look ahead, Lent is on the near horizon, beginning with Ash Wednesday on March 1. Some people choose to "give up" something for Lent, which can be a good way to increase mindfulness and focus. Mary Oliver, the poet, offers a perspective that invites us to give up certainty, in favor of embracing the mystery of truth, of God, of spirit, in her poem, "Mysteries, Yes."

Again on Ash Wednesday this year, we will offer "Ashes to Go" at the Vienna Coffee House, from 11 - 12:30 p.m., and 3 - 4:30 p.m. It has been very gratifying to see the people who come for ashes, and we get to hear a bit of their stories. Quite often they are people who have no real connection with the faith tradition of their childhood, but who long to reconnect to Mystery. Ash Wednesday is a day they find that they can do that, and an ash cross on their foreheads marks them not as one who has it all figured out, but as a seeker on a journey.

*Truly, we live with mysteries too marvelous  
to be understood.*

*How grass can be nourishing in the  
mouths of the lambs.*

*How rivers and stones are forever  
in allegiance with gravity  
while we ourselves dream of rising.*

*How two hands touch and the bonds will  
never be broken.*

*How people come, from delight or the  
scars of damage,  
to the comfort of a poem.*

*Let me keep my distance, always, from those  
who think they have the answers.*

*Let me keep company always with those who say  
"Look!" and laugh in astonishment,  
and bow their heads.*

*Mary Oliver, "Mysteries, Yes"*

May we keep company as we walk the road of Lent together, beginning at our Ash Wednesday dinner and 6 p.m. service on March 1st, and continuing through the celebration of Easter Sunday on April 16th.

## WHAT DO THEY DO WITH ALL THAT STUFF?

---

Have you ever wondered what happens with the tons of items that come into the Community Benefit Sale (CBS) donation room each day?

Some of the items are sold at the CBS and Antiques and Collectibles sale. Some items we don't need or can't sell, and those items are donated to Coalition of Appalachian Ministry and to Knox Area Rescue Ministries (KARM).

In the last quarter of 2016, the women shared 49 donations with KARM stores. Those donations helped provide 61,833 meals to guests at the Knox Area Rescue Ministries as well as the expenses associated with providing 25,476 beds during the last three months of 2016. To show their appreciation, KARM has gifted CBS with KARM gift cards. These gift cards can be used to purchase items in the KARM Thrift Stores. CBS has donated these cards to Family Promise, Good Neighbors, Lanier Elementary School and to Rockford Elementary School. Your donations to CBS are the gift that keeps on giving!

According to KARM, rescue and relationship result in restoration. Your donations have helped with the restoration of people. Good job, New Prov, keep it up!

This home will be provided for a family who currently lives in a small wooden shack with a dirt floor and no bathroom. The single mother, Natalia Cos Gonzales, has crippling arthritis and cannot work. The Porch is also starting a home for Elsa Marina Ruiz Alvarado, a single mother of five who has never had the money to send her children to school. ## HEALTH TIPS

---

### SEVEN SPIRITUAL PRACTICES

Cultivating our faith life is an important part of wellness. Here are a few ways to gain new perspectives of yourself, others and God throughout the year.

1. Try praying at different times during the day. You may notice that you pray differently at different times of the day.
2. Laughter and rejoicing need to be a part of our faith life. Think of something funny that has happened, and thank God for giving us humor in our lives.
3. Loving yourself is the first step in "love your neighbor as yourself." Spend a few minutes writing about what it means to love yourself. Remember that God loves you.
4. Meditation or listening is a part of our faith life that we often neglect. Consider taking five minutes to sit quietly and breathe. Try to quiet your inner voice and just listen.
5. Go for a prayerful walk and remember that all of creation belongs to God, though it can be easy to forget that. The air you breathe and the ground you walk on belong to God.
6. Pray a movement prayer. Stretch out your arms. Touch your toes. Stretch your neck. Feel the brilliance in God's creation and the way that your body is put together.
7. Thankfulness comes in a variety of forms. Each day make a list of everything that you encounter for which you are thankful. At the end of the day, incorporate the list into a prayer.

The Session of New Providence Presbyterian Church met on Tuesday, February 21 at 7:00 p.m.
