CEMETERY TOURS

In conjunction with the celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, the NPPC Adult Education Committee will be offering guided tours of the New Providence Cemetery. The tours are planned for Saturday, October 28th, from 4-6 p.m. and Sunday, October 29th, from 2-4 p.m. In addition to raising funds to support the maintenance of the cemetery, the tours will also serve to raise awareness in the church and in the wider community of the importance of this sacred and historically significant space.

The guided tours are open to the public and will provide information on a number of the individuals buried there. Tour groups are limited to 14 people each and will depart every 15 minutes during the 2 hour time frames. Musical entertainment and refreshments will also be provided in Westminster Hall. Cost of the tour is \$15 per person, with a maximum of \$40 per family. Children 5 years old and younger are free. Reservations are strongly recommended and can be made on-line at newprovidencepres.org/cemeterytours.

CHECK US OUT!

The next step in the reorganization of the NPPC Resource Center is getting materials in the hands of the congregation. When you enter the

library space on the second floor, you will find the children's books on the left in the Flo Alexander children's collection. We have board books from the stories of Jesus to *P.D. Bear's Words*. For preschoolers you will find an impressive collection of picture books. Check out such works as *Stone Soup* and *Queen Esther and Her People*. As you move down the left wall, notice a section for tweens and teens. The works of Laura Ingalls Wilder and C.S. Lewis are in this area along with more recent titles like *Finding God in the Hobbit*. As you first enter the library, you will see recent purchases on a center shelf. The rest of the books comprise an excellent collection for individual learning. We will be promoting some of these in this column in later months. As you pass through the library to Room 108, you will enter the curriculum area where you will find a wall of materials for group study. Also found in Room 108 are the large print books.

The final part of the Resource Center is the NPPC archives. This room, located on the third floor, is not open for browsing; but, soon you can access a listing of everything in this area. NPPC has a rich history that has much to offer us about the saints of the church and their faith journeys. If you are interested in helping us scan some of these materials, contact us in the e-mail below.

In order to access materials in all three places, the resource committee has developed a notebook found on the checkout counter in the library. All the different collections can be found in the book with their locations and call numbers if applicable. We have also posted instructions around the room and in the notebook to explain our new system for access. We do have one favor to ask. If, in the past, you

have checked out a book and failed to return it, please drop it into the basket on the checkout desk. You will not be excommunicated!

FROM THE PASTOR

I've always sympathized with the plate spinner at the circus, the person whose skill is balancing multiple plates, bowls or other flat objects atop poles. The objective is to keep them aloft before they wobble and fall to the ground.

And it's been one of those weeks for me. Pick your metaphor: too many plates spinning, too many moving parts, too many balls in the air, or irons in the fire. And so I've struggled all weekend to finish this article; every time I sit down to write, another plate wobbles.

But I'll be honest: the thing that's distracted me most is that every time I go to the computer, I think "well, I'll just check on what's happening in Houston," and before I know it, I've spent an hour reading news or watching reports about the flooding.

Thanks to all of you who have asked: my brother still lives in Houston, as does Steve Musick's sister and her family. But they are all safe, and will come through this disaster (relatively) unscathed. But it's heartbreaking to see such devastation in a place that we know like the backs of our hands. Steve and I both grew up in Houston, and so we recognize shopping malls full of abandoned cars, and barely visible road signs in familiar neighborhoods. The cemetery where my parents are buried is in a flood zone. Just this evening, a video showed a boat making its way up the street one block from my childhood home.

But while it may be sad for me to watch, my sentimental grief is nothing compared to those who have lost homes, loved ones, and livelihoods. There are people whose lives will never be the same again.

So this has been an interesting exercise in perspective-taking. The flooding in Houston is personal to me, but every single day someone around me is experiencing something that will change their life forever – for good or for ill. A child is born, or a loved one dies. A new job offer comes, or a dear friend moves. A storm descends, or the storm clouds lift – literally or metaphorically.

I have one of those silly "quote of the day" calendars in my kitchen (which frankly is too much to absorb – I can handle maybe 10 or 12 wise thoughts during a year, not 365!) But one of them has stuck with me since January. I'm

not sure of the source – the Internet attributes it to everyone from Plato to a

contemporary children's author.

Regardless, the idea is spot on: "Be kind, for everyone you meet is fighting a battle you know nothing about."

"Compassion" is what the Bible calls it: "When Jesus saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd." "When he went ashore, Jesus saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick." "While [the prodigal] was still far off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion."

There are so many stressors in the world today, some of which we are responsible for, and others that just blow up on us. Regardless, it seems we would all do well to err on the side of kindness and compassion. It won't necessarily calm the storms, but it sure will make them more bearable.

So I'm in. Are you?

GET PLUGGED INTO ADULT EDUCATION

There are a wide variety of offerings in our adult education classes at several different times for all ages.

The Men's Lectionary Bible Study examines the Revised Common Lectionary texts for the coming week. Led by Rev. Steve Musick, the group seeks to link the four passages to a common theme or meaning, and to link that further to our understanding of God's plan for us and the world. Meetings are held at the Vienna Coffee House at 7:30 a.m. on Monday mornings.

The Wednesday Afternoon Lectionary Study is led by Rev. Steve Musick. Blending elements of the Disciples Sunday school class and the Men's Lectionary Bible Study, this group nevertheless has a direction of its own that focuses on concrete and real-life challenges and applications for the insight gleaned through examining the four Revised Common Lectionary passages for the week. The class meets at Shannondale on Wednesday afternoons at 4 p.m.

NewProv Reads is a mid-week study/reading group open to adults of all ages. Readings are selected from a wide variety of topics and discussions are led by group participants and guest facilitators including NPPC staff and MC religion faculty. The group meets on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the Parlor.

The Women's Study Group meets in the Parlor on the second and fourth Mondays of the month at 7:00 p.m. Led by Melanie Rasnake, Emily Anderson, and various group participants, this class studies a wide variety of topics from Bible studies to popular books.

New Prov U is an opportunity for the congregation, especially those 55 and older, to find enrichment opportunities from a variety of presentations. Participation does not require backpacks, tests, or papers! Lunch begins at 11:30 a.m. followed by a one-hour program at 12:00 noon.

The Presbyterian Women's Circles meet the first Thursday of the month for fellowship and Bible study in a group setting.

The Men's Witnessing Square meets the second and fourth Wednesday of the month in the Youth room at 7:30 a.m. with a focus on current events, prayer, Bible study and fellowship.

During the month of October, the Adult Education Committee will be sponsoring a special series on various topics related to the Reformation. The classes will be held each Sunday morning in October in Westminster Hall during the Sunday school hour and will be led by NPPC members and staff.

THANKS FOR THE MEMORIES

New Providence has been a part of my life for more than a decade. Chris Vogado, child of this church and close friend of mine, asked me to fill in one week for the FirstLight service with no talk of continuing further. That first Thursday when I showed up for rehearsal I had no idea just how much this place, and the people who make up this church, would become a source of comfort, of growth, and of family for me. I consider myself unbelievably fortunate to have spent so many years here.

That is what makes this next part so hard. This week I accepted the position of Director of Contemporary Worship and Arts at Covenant Presbyterian Church in Charlotte, NC. I wasn't looking for a new job, but received a call from a friend who had been approached for recommendations. This position, as much as any church job can be one thing only, will be centered on music and worship, allowing me to focus and develop in a way that has been difficult with my current split position. I have prayed, discussed, spent many nights awake pondering, and turned over every stone in considering this change. Although I ultimately made the decision to accept the position and leave New Providence, it was one of the hardest decisions I've ever made.

To my youth, Please know that although I am leaving, I am not leaving you. I have loved being your youth director and will cherish the memories of these years for the rest of my life. I promise, as trite as it sounds, that I have learned more from you than you from me. I hope that you continue to question and challenge, that you continue to grow in your faith, and that you always strive to be an example of Christ's love in this world. I am not leaving because of anything you did or didn't do, and I am not leaving to be someone else's youth director. You will almost certainly be my last group of youth, and for that I am glad, not because I want to be away from you, but because I don't think anyone else would compare.

To the parents of youth, thank you. Thank you for trusting me with what

you hold most dear. Thank you for being so committed to the spiritual development of your children. Thank you for being so willing to step up and get things done when required. Thank you for the faith you have put in me. I hope that I have mostly lived up to it. I will do my absolute best to leave this program in excellent shape to continue without me, and to transition smoothly to the next person fortunate enough to hold this position. The most important person in the faith formation of your children is you, and for that I give thanks because I know they will be just fine.

To everyone at New Providence, thank you. Over the last decade you have supported me, worshipped with me, and helped me grow in ways that I may never fully realize. I came to this place a twenty something child, with little idea of what I wanted to do with my life. You are responsible for a large part of the man I have become, and I hope I have at least occasionally made you proud of that. You have watched me grow up and will forever hold a place in my heart. As Emily says when she baptizes a child of the church, "We will never be the same because of you" and I will never be the same because of you.
